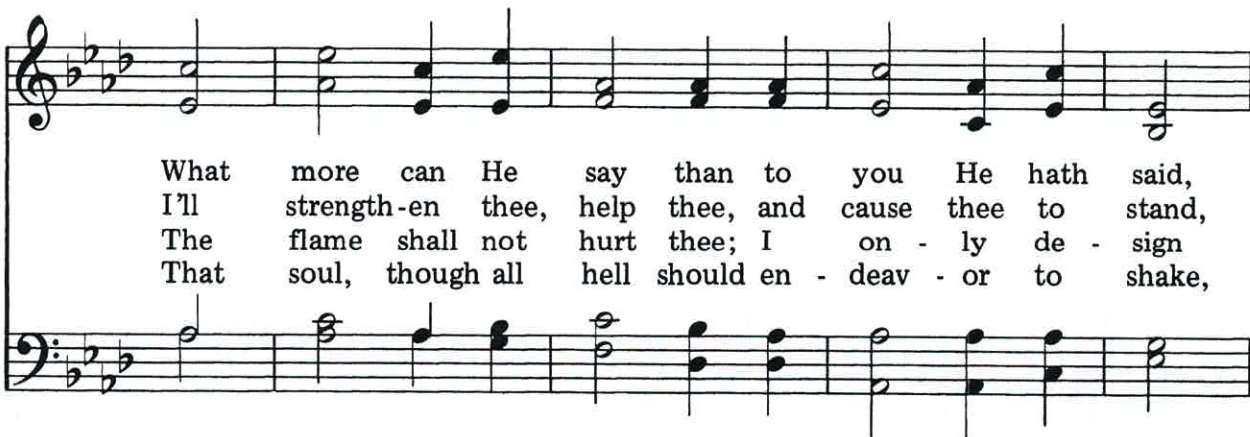

 I will not, I will not de - sert to its foes;



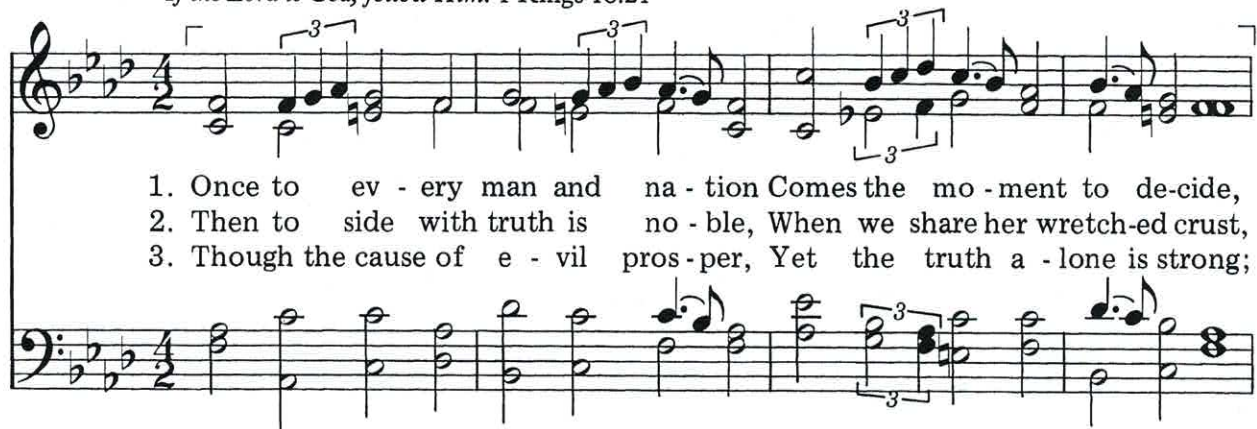
What more can He say than to you He hath said,

475 Once to Every Man and Nation

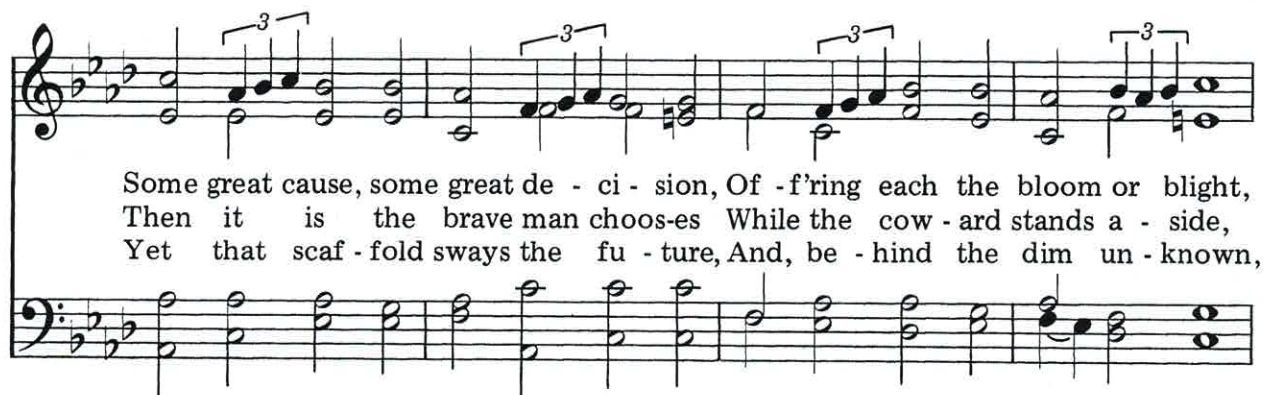
If the Lord is God, follow Him. 1 Kings 18:21

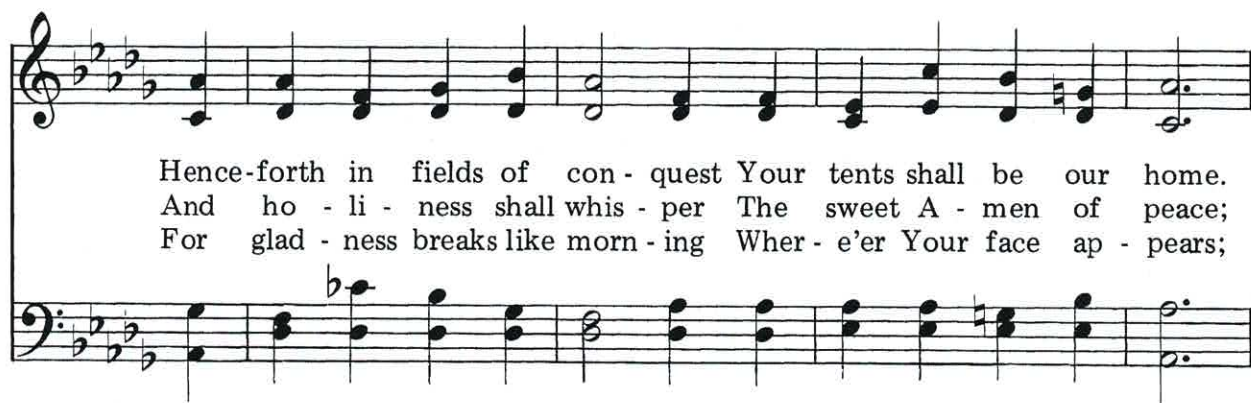

You guided Your people to make for Yourself a glorious name. Isa. 63:14



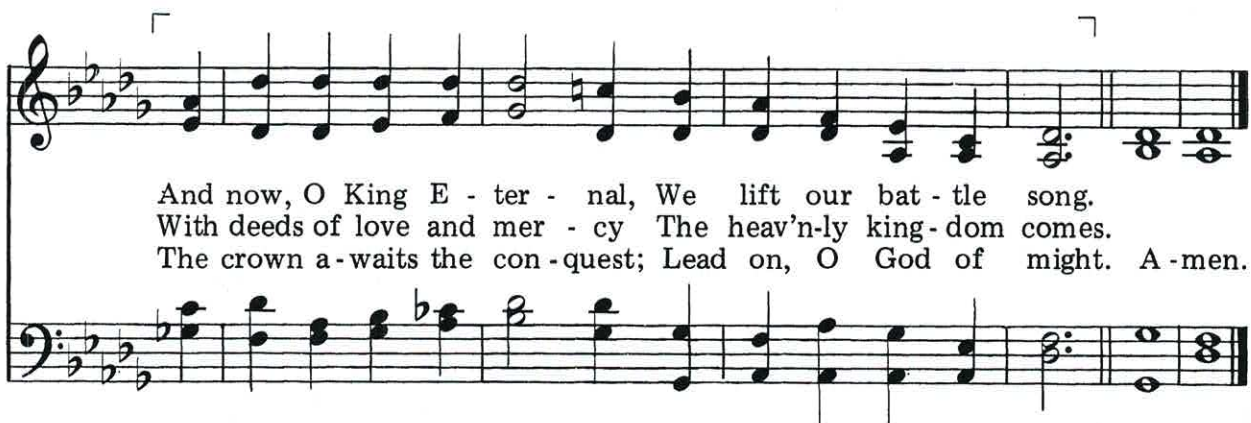
1. Lead on, O King E - ter - nal, The day of march has come;
