3. Financial Updates

Contracts: Our contracts are beginning to be awarded and that's good. The big difference with the contracts this year is that I have worked with IMCOM to write these contracts as Base Contracts (1 year) with 4 Option Years. That means, no longer will the Garrison have to write yearly contracts (at least not for the next 5 years). NAF Contracts (such as WatchCare, Pianist, Organist, Worship LDR, etc.) can simply "roll-over" into the next year without having to be re-written, re-bid and run the risk of delay in being awarded. If the Garrison Chaplain (with advisement from his/her PAC) wants to renew a contract, it's a simple Memorandum to CCBC and G9 to renew. That ensures no gaps or 120 days waiting. This is VERY good news that G9/IMCOM and CCBC agreed to write the contracts for us this way! However, if we want to forego a contract, we always have the option to not select the option for the upcoming year and re-bid the contract. But now, you don't HAVE TO do it this way unless you want to or need to (if a contractor moves-on, etc.). I made sure we did all we could to change this process and our RM team worked extra to get it done. The hope is that for the next few years (when I'm long gone), you have seamless support from your contracts without having to write 11 each year. This is a better way and should service you and give you predictability (as much as you can get that in government work).

Next Contracts to be Awarded & RSO Process to Inform: I have made a process to inform those awarded contracts so that we can be immediate to notify, once we are notified a contract has been awarded. SSG Hughes will contact MSG Henderson and myself, and since I am out of office this week, MSG Henderson will be the one to call the person awarded the contract to let them know it's been awarded. Right now, only Watchcare has been awarded – per our request that it come first. Next, I am told by IMCOM it will be Sherry, Bob and two others from other Services. As soon as we know, we will seek to call you and let you know. We are also happy to answer any questions you may have when we call. I expect all contracts to be awarded by Xmas – but you never know as it's dependent on their office and manpower issues.

The positive side to this, for at least those whom we know through the SS Bible Study, is that they all had friends and or families to share Thanksgiving with; they did not spend the holiday alone.

 - o Bible Study. We conduct a Bible Study in the Single Soldiers Barracks with dinner,1800-1930 each Thursday (average of 8 in attendance).
